Shop Notes by Beth Farmer

Well, the shop is experiencing a rough spot in operations. I spent a couple of hours cleaning out one of the water cooled trim saws that someone put oil inside....Not the first time this has happened, but always a surprise!

We have the second trim saw awaiting new bearings and shaft, Ken P. pulled it apart and replacement parts had to be custom built by a machinist for the saw.

The 24" saw needed new pulleys and a drive shaft, which Ken P. also repaired. The 18" saw rock vise was over torqued and a cast part cracked in two. It is waiting for brazing at a welding shop.

There may be a problem with the large saw by the back door. The motor tripped out but cooled off and did reset. This is a large, expensive motor if it should end up that it needs to be replaced.

The larger of the sphere machines has had 2 pulleys replaced, but is still in need of a third.

The faceting room has ordered new dops and laps; thanks go out to John G. for keeping on top of that!

Looking at our wooden dop stick supplies, it appears that the medium sized are hard to find.

I did clean out the drawer of dop wax particles and sticks that had red wax on them. If there is anyone who would like to saw out some new dop sticks, please contact me. We have new dowels that will do the trick.

If you were wondering what that fancy green press is all about, our resident Russian scientist (I believe his name is Andre I'm sorry I am so bad with names!) rescued it from his workplace. The press will be used for pressing forms, shapes and patterns into metals. Look at the Rio Grande catalog to see what we can do with this (under Bonny Doon presses).



A Labor of Love (or insanity) by Anthony Cooper

Once upon a stormy board meeting, there arose a crisis and suddenly there was a reluctant webmaster welcomed into your midst. As he sat there browsing the room for things to interest him, he spied filing cabinets full of historical treasures. Soon he, Toe-Knee (MGSCV Webmaster) and his wife, Sheryl (MGSCV Secretary) took on a new task. We decided to scan all the old Petrographs and post them on the new web site.

First, the web site had to be created. Then, a scheme established for how to display all the Petrographs. Then the real work started. Sheryl began borrowing the historical Petrographs and bringing them home. At work, I had access to a copier that would scan documents directly into PDF format. From there a few technical things happened that resulted in the best possible copies of the Petrographs being turned into digital documents.

I began to notice the rich history of the Mineral and Gem Society of Castro Valley that was documented on the covers, and to admire the work that the many years of toil had created. When I found the Petrograph with my grandfather-in-law on the cover (October 1982), I knew I had to do something. That is when I knew this article had to be written, but I soon discovered that I had no idea what to write.

One thing did hit me was to create a video that faded from one cover to the next, but there are 516 covers. If I showed you each one for 5 seconds, that would be over 43 minutes of video. The covers are interesting but not 43 minutes worth. I cut the covers down to 1 second, with a 1 second transition. They are way too fast to study, but I put decade markers on the video so that if something does strike your interest you'll have an idea where to look in the Petrographs. I'm particularly fond of the early 70s covers. I encourage you to take a look at the video at

Upcoming Classes

Lost Wax Class

Session 1 will be on JUNE 26th at 10 AM and covers preparing the wax forms for casting. The session 2 is JULY 10TH at 10 AM and will cover how to clean up your cast piece in preparation for mounting your stone. You must bring your own silver (~30% 1 oz. of new casting grain) to session 1. You must also pre-pay for the class. The total for the two classes is \$30.00 plus the casting fee (1.00-3.00 depending upon the size of your casting). You will get a wax kit which includes a wax tool and wax needed for your project, and you will need to provide the cab to work with. Additional instructions are on the faceting room door in the lobby at the club. Each class will last 3-4 hours. 
