Old Business: No obvious alternatives to current meeting location have been discovered. We just need a key from the Church to continue meeting there. Betty will follow up.

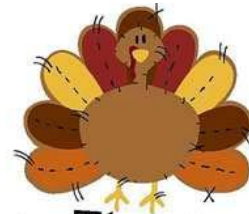
There will be no Board meetings during July and August, but outstanding business will be conducted via email. Show meeting to be held on July 19.

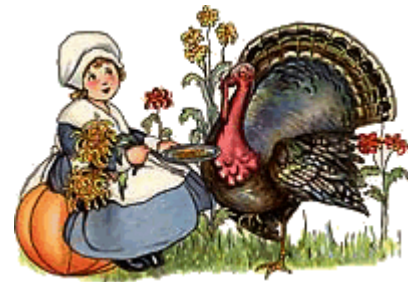

The MGSCV Annual Gem and Jewelry Show runs March 2, 3 and 4, 2012. Mark the dates on your calendar for the first Friday, Saturday and Sunday of March 2012 at the Newark Pavilion.

Volunteers are the backbone of MGSCV all year long, but particularly for the Annual Show. As you signed your annual Membership form, you learned that it is our annual show that funds the club, workshop and all activities. By signing the membership application you agreed, as a requirement of your membership, to work at the show for a minimum of 4 to 6 hours. Preferably 2 hours each day in various positions. As a volunteer you are entitled to free admittance to the show. Just show your membership card at the door.

During January and February you will be receiving a call asking you to volunteer at the show. Be enthusiastic in your response. The caller is asking you to work one or two of the many volunteer positions needed. You need not wait for a call. Sign up to work at the show on the Sign-Up Pages in the binder at the shop and at the General meetings.

Some of the work involved includes - **Set-up** occurs from 9 a.m. on the days leading up to the show. The more help, the easier the work. Unload the storage container, set up and drape tables, help construct the external structure (light baffle) on the Fluorescent Hall on Tuesday morning, assemble display cases, unload the food delivery on Thursday, etc. **Electrical** requires at least 2 tall able-

bodied men to do the installation under the supervision of Jim Ewing on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday morning.

Admission team greets the public, accepts their money, offers a Program, and shows them the way to the Dealers. **Security** will roam each zone of the halls to maintain a pleasant, safe environment for all. **Food Service** includes working in the main kitchen, the snack bar, and cashier for each. **Spinning Wheel** runs all 3 days of the show (except for bad weather).

Raffle will sell tickets for the 2012 Raffle Prize to be picked Sunday at 4p.m.

Auction team runs the auction and hands out all of the purchased items. The Show Committee meets the 3rd Tuesday of every month at 7 p.m. upstairs at the shop. Come join the committee and participate in the decision making. Please do not be stingy with your time. Also remember any of your friends and family members who would like to volunteer are welcome to join us.

REMEMBER WHEN

I have been writing for the Petrograph for 15 or more years. I thought members would find this clip from 1995 interesting.

You probably have kept track of the cost of gold and silver, but never took the time to figure out the cost of the metal in a piece you've made. If you are working with gold, you probably will be working with pennyweights. A pennyweight is equivalent to 1.55 grams, and one troy ounce is equal to 31.10348 grams, this means there are 20.066761 pennyweights in a troy ounce. If gold is going for \$400 per troy ounce, divide that price (\$400) by the number of pennyweights in a troy ounce (20.066761), and that tells you that at \$400 an ounce a pennyweight of pure gold (24K) costs about \$19.93; 18K gold would be worth \$15 and 14K would be worth \$11.67, and 10K would be worth \$8.33. Now let's consider silver. At \$6.00 per troy ounce, a gram is worth 19 cents.

So check the conversion table which tells you how much silver you need and multiply by 19 if silver is \$6.00."

...And now, how about a dose of 2011 reality. As of this writing gold is over \$1800 and silver over \$39 a troy ounce. HMMM \$39.00 divided by 400 and multiplied by the number of grams..... Oh Ouch! My head hurts; you do the math. Let me know what numbers you come out with. On second thought...please don't.



BENCH TIPS

Homemade Wax Tools

Save your used Xacto or scalpel blades for utility work on the bench. They're wonderful for delicate wax work. Use a cutoff blade or a grinding wheel to shape the blades to what you need (wear safety glasses). For instance, you can carve away excess metal on the spine to make yourself some narrow carving knives that do a great job of detailing small areas of your waxes.

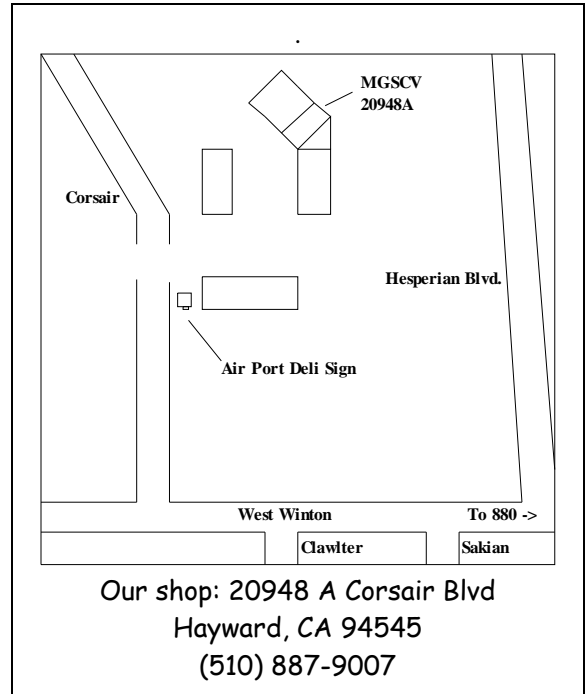
