Program: DVD "The Universe, It Fell From Space"

In 2008 asteroid TC3 was spotted heading for Earth. They calculated the impact site to be the Nubian Desert in Northern Sudan. It exploded above the desert and there were no reports of injury or damage. A search recovered 280 fragments, totaling 11 pounds, for further study. It is called an asteroid while it is in space, a meteor when it hits the atmosphere and meteorite when it hits the

ground. There are 170 impact craters still visible on the Earth today. Several experiments were discussed about various craters and how they came to be, along with possible events caused by them. Arizona State University has the largest collection of meteorites. In 2007 there was an impact near Caracas, Peru close to the Bolivian border. This crater is 15 feet deep and about 15 yards wide. As space debris falls back to Earth it is study to see what materials survive space and which ones do not.

Sorry, Rick Kennedy couldn't make it tonight. We are talking to him about a future meeting.



February Bench Tips

Please add this extra information into the tip for the Wax Pen. You can make your own wax pen from a small soldering iron plugged into a light dimmer switch for heat control. Both components are easily found at Radio Shack, a big hardware store or at Harbor Freight. For an example of the dimmer and soldering iron, see www.harborfreight.com items # 43060 and # 47887 Look for a soldering iron of

around 25-30 watts. File the tip to the shape you prefer or even better get a soldering iron with replaceable tips. Then you can make several tip shapes for different tasks. Set the dimmer control just hot enough to melt the wax without producing any smoke.



HAZARDS IN THE ROCK SHOP

Wherever there is machinery, there is a chance for accidents. Chemicals are also a safety concern and both are found in a lapidary shop.

To protect yourself (and others) wear those safety glasses and pay attention to what you are doing. In a rock shop carelessness can cause lots of problems besides the loss of your rock or stone. You can easily lose a finger or an eye, and flying rock chips can create a hazardous situation for any others who may be working near you.

Most stones have a heavy concentration of silicon and therefore breathing the silicon dust can cause permanent damage to delicate lung tissues and silicosis, a disease of the lung. Make sure you use water, or other appropriate lubricant, when grinding or polishing. The heating of some stones can release toxic fumes. Amber is a resin and is easily overheated. Some stones such as serpentine have asbestos in their makeup. Wear a mask as a precaution. Our shop forbids cutting abalone and other shells.

Know the makeup of material you are working with and proceed with caution.

Alcohol and acetone are slightly toxic to the skin, and of course they are very flammable, so take care when handling your alcohol burner. Nail polish remover contains acetone often used to clean up a wax. Our alcohol has some acetone in it as many of the ladies have found out.

Proper ventilation is important in working with the above materials. Respiratory masks are a good idea, and use lots of water when you are grinding and polishing your stones. Water flushes and cools your stone. Since even polishing can leave a residue of grit on the equipment that can easily scratch your stones, be sure to spray your sander, grinder, and polisher before you start work. Your predecessor may have left a mess.

Consider using ear plugs if you are working around noisy equipment for more than a couple of minutes. And be sure to wear appropriate garb. Clothing and hair can get caught in equipment, open toed shoes can leave you open to some bad bruises and possibly a broken bone. You should not wear long sleeved clothing when working around grinding wheels or saws, as the sleeves can get caught in the equipment and pull your hand or arm in to the spinning blade, wheel, or stone.

We are all here to have fun, and play with our rocks, not win a beauty contest as one of our members remarked. So don't worry about looking fashionable, worry about looking smart and being safe.




ACIDS

Two things you should remember from your high school chemistry class--treat acids with respect. Also-- always add acid to water, never the other way around.

The acid most of us know is vinegar and fortunately, it can be used quite safely. We even use it to make salad dressing. Of course, it is usually less than 6% in concentration. Vinegar is the common name for acetic acid.

When using acids, work in a well ventilated environment and keep the solutions in ceramic or glass containers. If necessary to heat an acid solution, do it slowly. Wear appropriate protective clothing, glasses and gloves. Etching is a result of acid on metal and it can have the same effect on you or your clothing.

Should you accidentally spill acid, wash immediately and follow with a solution of bicarbonate of soda. This will neutralize the acid. Nitric, hydrochloric and sulfuric are especially corrosive. When you use pickle, an acid solution, always use copper tongs to remove your silver or gold findings.




