Program: The California Blue Mine: A New Gem Pegmatite in California presented by Rick Kennedy

The mine is in Yucca Valley with 110 degree summers and freezing winters. Dave went exploring one day and he saw something that looked different. The further he went the more interesting the rocks got. He found pegmatite. A pegmatite is a very crystalline, intrusive igneous rock composed of interlocking crystals. Then he found beryl crystal. He dug some and then started making claims and digging further down finding more crystals. He didn't realize there was stuff in the dirt he left behind as he hauled the items home. He found aquamarine, clear topaz and fluorite. Everything was dug by hand to this point.

In November 2011 they started using an excavator. They found Clevelandite with aquamarine growing through it. As time went on they found more and more crystals.

They started naming the pockets to help identify items and keep track of where they were found for the collectors.

At the end of the presentation there was a question and answer session with Rick. He also brought a table full of specimens to view and touch. He happily answered everyone's questions and listened to our comments.

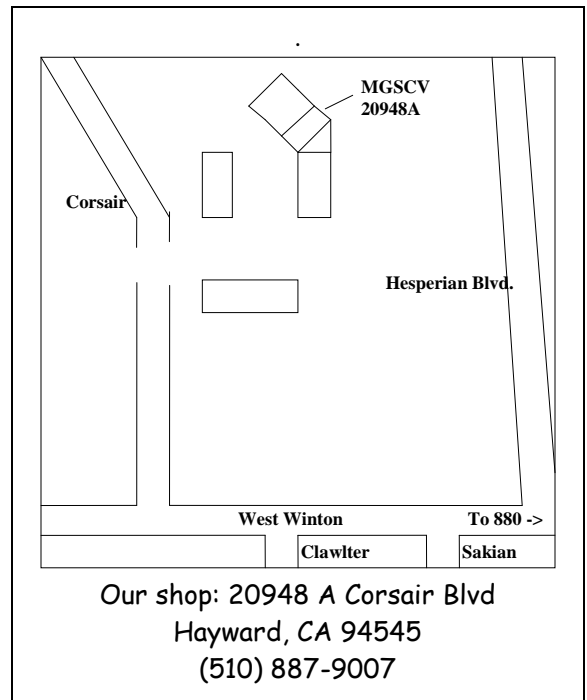

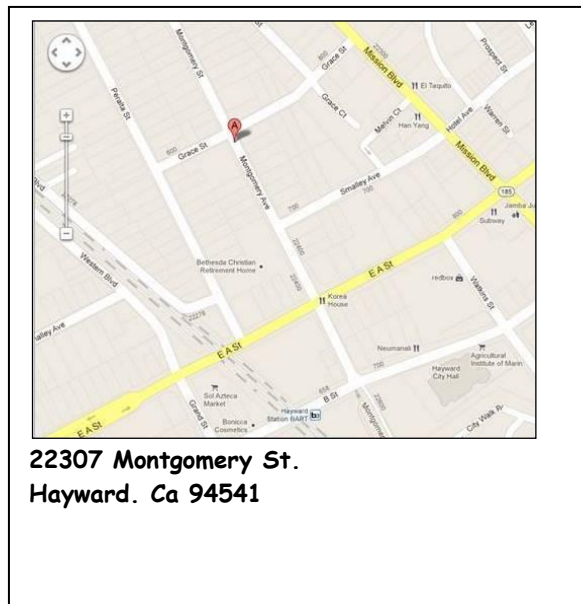

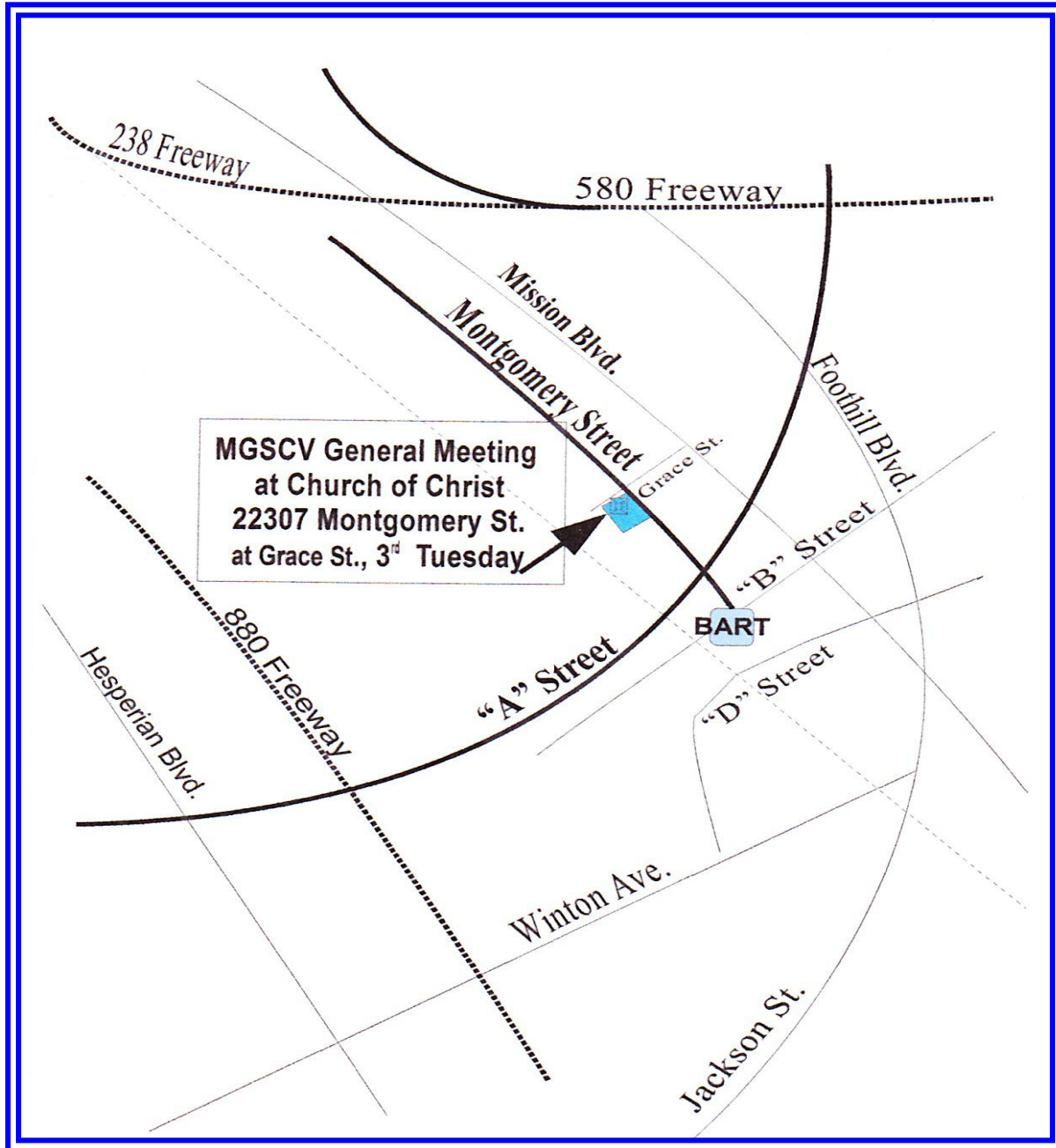
