Meeting Minutes

BOARD MEETING -Nov.12th, 2012

Ron Miller called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. In attendance were **Ron Miller, Betty Milam, Sheryl Cooper, Bonnie Andrade, Mike McBride, Cathy Miller, Diana Cohoon, Beth Farmer, and Norm Hodgson**

Treasurer: We reviewed the July, August, September, and October treasurer's report from **Betty Milam**. **Beth Farmer** moved to accept the reports as presented. **Norm Hodgson** seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Minutes: **Beth Farmer** moved to accept the July, August, September and October board minutes as printed in the Petrograph. **Betty Milam** seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Shop: Two motors were replaced - one in a saw and the other in the sphere machine. Saw blades and Genie wheels have been ordered. We need to purchase a barrel of oil for the saws. There is concern over how much was used in such a short time. We will have to wait until next year to make the purchase. The building management is changing hands. As of Nov 1st PG&E switched us from a flat rate to time of use rates. We are getting new neighbors and the PG&E meter is partly shared with the neighbors. So Betty will monitor the bill online and see what happens.

Show: The Pavilion agreed to supply us with a copy the plans that are being submitted for the permit and a copy of the work to be

done, so they were given the check for the permits. We discussed the additional fees the Pavilion is asking for the actual work. Greg Burg is helping us interrupt the plans and the cost. Sally is working on the flyers, raffle tickets, and programs for the show. Most of the contracts have been delivered. The fluorescent dealers are asking for back tables.

Editor: Since the Petrograph has been emailed to the other societies and clubs we have been getting responses, questions, and information to include in our newsletter or post at the shop. **Diana** is enjoying all of the communications.

Education: There was a real nice opal class by **Ed Rigor**. **Diana** is holding lost wax classes. They are still working on getting another soldering class.

Elections: We discussed the slate of Officers for next year. The open positions are - director 2nd year and 3rd year. **Ron** would like to step down from presidency.

Budget: **Betty** presented a budget for next year and it was discussed. Norm Hodgson moved to accept the budget with a small change. **Diana Cohoon** accepted the motion and it was carried unanimously.

New Business: We talked about a pay pal account and **Tony Cooper** was appointed to look into it and set it up. He will also work on an electronic membership application to be used with pay pal. We discussed adding the feature of paying for classes through pay pal. It will need more discussion.

Program: We watched You Tube Videos on natures living gem stone - Baltic Amber.

Amber has been used for years in jewelry, furniture, decorations, artwork and medicinal uses. The variance in color is due to trapped air bubbles. The more air bubbles the whiter the stone. Opaque and yellow amber are the most abundant. The rarest is transparent. Scientists are interested in the animals and vegetation that is encased in the amber. They have found samples from millions of years ago. We saw many beautiful examples of what you can be done with amber - from rings and pendants to artwork and large pieces of furniture. BRAD SMITH BENCH TIPS

OCHRE APPLICATOR

Yellow ochre is used when you want to be sure the solder will not flow onto an area of your piece while you're soldering on another area. The only problem with ochre is coming up with a good way to store and apply it. I like recycled nail polish bottles. They seal well and have a built-in brush. Just clean them out with a little acetone or nail polish remover, and they're ready to go.

SANDING/POLISHING IN TIGHT PLACES

Often you'll need to sand or polish an area that's impossible to reach with even a small wheel on a flexshaft. Other times it might be the bottom of a pocket or inside bottom corner of a box that needs to be finished. One trick for these nit-picky jobs may be

left over from your last Chinese dinner - a chopstick.

I've found quite a few uses for these in the shop. Prepare the tip by simply sawing it off at a 45 degree angle. Then apply whatever abrasive grit you will need for the job or hold a strip of sandpaper around the end. Loose grit can be held onto the tip with a bit of Vaseline or oil. Tripoli or rouge can be just rubbed onto the end of the chopstick.

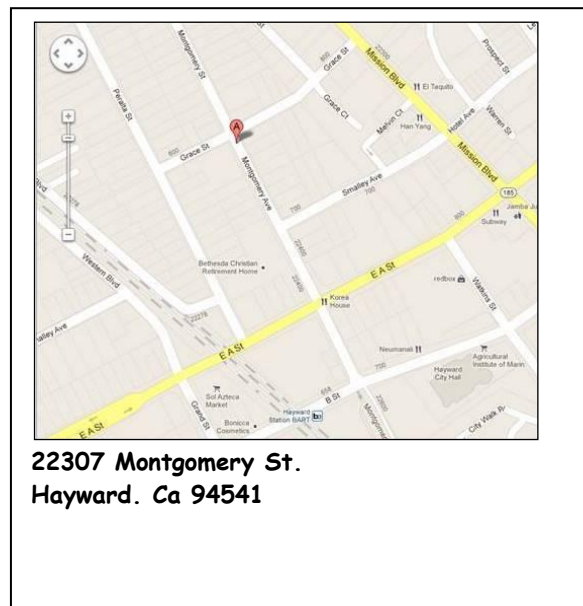
