Cab of the Month: We had 3 cabs submitted this month. Congratulations to **Lawrence Keyte**.


Drawings: The name for the \$100 member drawing was **Chris PaVel-Ligon**, unfortunately she was not present to win.

#### Birthstones

Like many other kids around my age, my first exposure to gemstones was birthstones. Stones assigned to a specific month in the year, birthstones are well known in the United States. Because each person has a stone somewhat specific to them, a sense of curiosity about their stone is evoked. I experienced this curiosity while in the second grade. As a second grader, owning your own birthstone made you achieve the highest level of "coolness." Birthstones almost gave you as much playground respect as if you owned a mood ring, another piece of jewelry that was held in high esteem in the eyes of these second graders. Even now, I don't really understand why these items were so fascinating to us. But thinking back, owning a topaz necklace (my birthstone) made me feel as if I had something unique to only me (and the other millions of people born in November, but I did not realize that at the time). Having a sense of individuality made me more confident, and I wore my topaz proudly. Only now am I more concerned as to the history of these stones, and why topaz had

to be the particular stone I was attached to. After doing some research, I found that these specific gems were worn on the breastplate of Aaron, as described in the bible. Later on, authors theorized that each stone was connected with astrological signs and that if the stones worn during that month, they would help you with your health and challenges you face. But, not until the 1700's did people begin to wear their birthstone month-round. But, the specified list of stones corresponding with their month was only released in 1912 by the National Association of Jewelers. Since then, birthstones have been assigned to specific months, and people wear their own birthstone year-round. Even though these stones began as a religious object, they are now quite well known to all people around the United States, and has helped the people wearing the stones feel more unique. No two gems are totally alike, which personalizes every stone. Once again, jewelry makes its owner even more proud in their pieces with deeper recognition of the history of their stone.


